



## Suellen V. Siebert

October 16, 1945 - September 15, 2020

Suellen Varnell Siebert, 74, passed away on September 15, 2020 in her home in Austin, Texas, with her daughters Amy and Evelyn by her side. Suellen was born in El Reno, Oklahoma on October 16, 1945 to Elsie Ann (Womack) and Charles Edward Varnell. She graduated from El Reno High School and later from the University of Oklahoma and worked as a registered nurse, with many years at VA hospitals in Oklahoma City and San Antonio and five years in the US Air Force. Suellen loved to cook for her family, especially baking bread and pies. Gardening was a passion, and she became a Bexar County (San Antonio) Master Gardener.

Suellen was preceded in death by her beloved husband of 30 years, Marvin Siebert; parents Charles and Elsie Varnell; and stepdaughter Valerie (Siebert) Garcia. 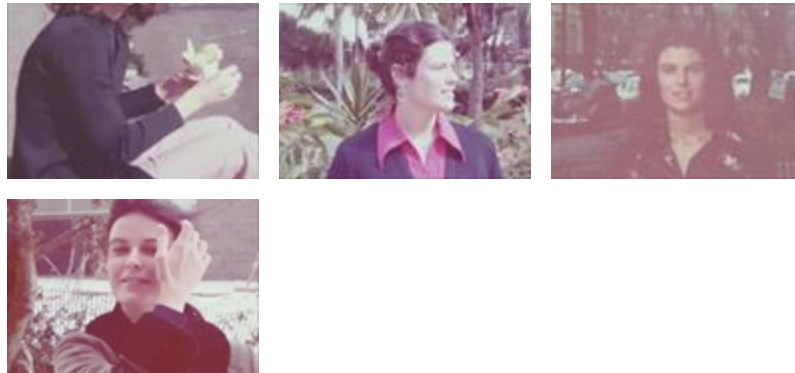

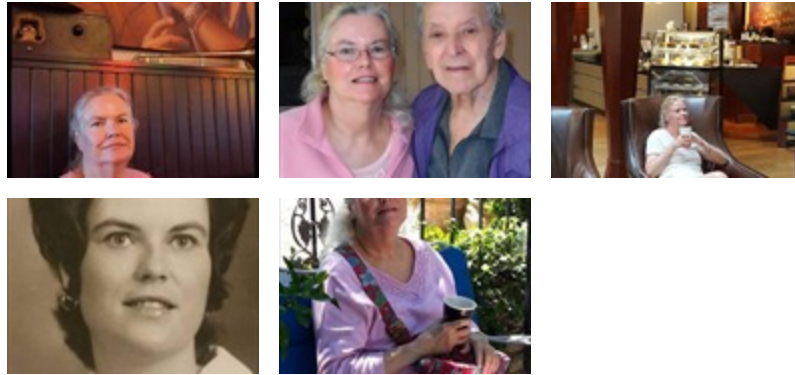
