



Sunny Suhor

May 8, 1930 - October 20, 2017

Milton Lee “Sunny” Suhor, 87, died peacefully on October 20, 2017 surrounded by her children, family, and loved ones at New Haven in Schertz, Texas. Sunny was the youngest of three girls born to parents Louise Agnes Gray and Milton Lawrence Harris of Litcher, Louisiana. She is preceded in death by her sisters, Marion Cottrell and Millie Luter, and her husband, Leo Suhor.

When Sunny was born on May 8, 1930, her mother Louise reported “she came out smiling.” Sunny was always smiling, especially after she met her husband Leo in 1947. To perhaps the eternal regret of her steady boyfriend Al, Sunny took the place of a friend for a blind date and met a dashing young naval officer named Leo. She was hooked from the moment he put her scarf on his head and declared himself Yvonne De Carlo: eight months later, they were engaged. On their wedding day, Sunny wrote that she “never dreamed two people could be so happy,” and she carried that love and fidelity for Leo until the end of her days.

They settled in San Antonio in 1967, and Sunny worked for many years as an escrow officer at Alamo Title Company. She was a joyful fixture of her community, a ferocious competitor at weekly bingo, and devout member of St. Gregory the Great Catholic Church. Sunny also enjoyed playing bunco with her church community and square dancing with her favorite partner. She and

Leo built a large family with one son and four daughters. They are survived by all their children: Lynda Tilley, Susan Stintzman, Leo Suhor and his wife Maki, Mary Kotara and her husband John, and Kathy Strimple. Sunny was grandmother to ten grandchildren, eleven great-grandchildren, and a large number of dogs.

While age may have limited Sunny's abilities in her later years, it could not dim the light of her soul, nor chase away the pleasure of the slow, charming drawl of "Hello Dahlin" when her loved ones came to visit. She lived her life with grace, generosity, and peace and called all those around her to do the same. Sunny loved the large family she and Leo built, and her greatest joy was seeing the successes of her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. As her family grew, Sunny delighted in every new birth, adoption, baptism, and graduation. She was a fixture at birthday parties, firmly convincing us that Irish cream and vanilla cakes are highly superior to chocolate, for which we stand eternally corrected. Sunny's daughters and granddaughters will always remember her persistent prayers during each pregnancy for more little girls in the family, and they will cherish the smile on her face because she got her wish so often.

Services will be held on Friday, October 27, 2017, beginning with a rosary and mass at St. Gregory the Great at 12:30 p.m. and a burial service at 2:30 p.m. at Holy Cross Cemetery. In lieu of flowers, the family requests that donations be made in her name to the American Cancer Society in honor of Sunny surviving cancer in 1989.
