With a bohemian heart and an avant garde way of thinking, Theo was one in a million and her generous spirit will remain unmatched. Her calling as a Family Nurse Practitioner perfectly reflected her compassionate nature. She boasted an extraordinary wealth of experiences but the greatest role of her life was that of grandma.
