Devoted to Family and Career

Thurman Kennedy passed away at rest on Monday June 2, 2008. He was born in Burkburnett Texas August 15, 1924 and grew up on a livestock farm in Wichita County. Thurman was a proud class of 1946 graduate of Texas A&M University. Upon graduation from A&M, he began a distinguished career with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service and married Jean Boyd in February 1949. During the course of his career, Thurman served as an Agricultural Extension Agent in Stonewall, Young, and Bexar counties.

The recipient of numerous professional awards and commendations, his career was highlighted by his service as President of the Texas County Agricultural Agents Association in 1964 and as President of the National Association of County Agricultural Agents in 1976. Throughout his career in San Antonio, Thurman was involved with the San Antonio Chamber of Commerce Farm and Ranch Committee, the South Texas Farm and Ranch Club, the Bexar County Junior Livestock Show, and the San Antonio Livestock Show and Rodeo. After retirement, he became the Assistant Director, then Director of the San Antonio Livestock Show. He was the 1990 recipient of the Joe Freeman Award from the San Antonio Chamber of Commerce in recognition of his contributions to agribusiness in San Antonio and South Texas. Thurman was recently preceded in death by Jean, his wife of 59 years.

He is survived by his sons Jim, Jeff, and Joe, 4 grandchildren, 4 great grandchildren, sister in law Louise Perry and her husband Dr. Dale Perry, daughter in law Marcela Kennedy, nephew Henry Huggins, and many friends and neighbors.
