Timothy G. Taylor was born in Houlton, Maine. When he was 6 years old, he fell through an ice covered pond while skating with his older brother David. David saved him and sent him home to thaw. Tim claimed to have heard Angels singing their beautiful music. This event shaped his love of life and the will to survive to the ripe old age of 75. With his passion for music and his sense of humor, he won many friends and his mantra became “Don’t take life so seriously, you’ll never get out of it alive”. Tim was preceded in death by his father, Glen O. Taylor and recently his mother Madeline B. Taylor who lived to be 101 years old, also by his brothers, Michael, and David, and his sister Judy Olds. He is survived by his devoted wife of 52 years, Jolene, and by his loving children, Melanie Anne and her husband Steve Hudson, and his devoted son Daniel. Tim was blessed with two grandchildren, Lauren Hudson and Nicholas Hudson who were born on and near his birthday. Tim is survived by his loving sister Mary Lou Taylor Knox and her husband Hubbard Knox, by his sisters-in-law and brothers-in-laws, nieces, nephews and friends who thought so much of him and shared so many happy memories of his passion for music and merriment. Tim became an honorary Texan in 1966, when he discovered that he could play golf without having to shovel the snow away to find the ball. He retired to Point Venture, Texas and became a member of the Point Venture

golf association where he enjoyed the comraderies of all his golf buddies. After having a full and happy life, he has now been called home to sing with the Angels. It is hard to let him go but we now know we will meet again one day.

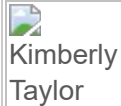
