She was born on December 23, 1942 in Devine Texas. She grew up in the country, in her early years she and her family worked picking cotton and various fields.

She traveled and told us stories about her adventures working as a migrant worker. She had great memories of her pet goat that she would take to school with her and tie to a tree during her school day, and enjoyed riding motorbikes through the dirt roads, playing baseball, jumping a train to catch a ride to a neighboring town not realizing the speed of the train; this grew her love of the outdoors.

She came to San Antonio at the age of 16 and began employment at H-E-B

Grocery Stores as a Butcherette. She met her future husband at work and at 18 years of age; she and my dad were married.

He was drafted into the Army and stationed stateside, she left her job and traveled with him and resided for a time in Maryland.

After his tour, they returned to San Antonio, where they started their family.

She was a housewife and raised her family then began her new job at Fred's Fish Fry, where she worked for 20 plus years at many locations, with Culebra Rd. and Bandera Rd. being her longest assignments; often driving her Motorcycle to and from work, ultimately leaving the company circa 2014.

Her Fred's customers loved her, and up to her final days recognized her in the community and that brought her great joy.

She loved her children and grandchildren and devoted her life to caring, nurturing and helping to raise them and instilling important values.

She loved our Lord and was a follower of Christ, devoting her time to prayer and testifying the Greatness of our God, and His promises of salvation and eternal life.

She prayed the Most Holy Rosary every day and shared that Love and Spiritual guidance with all of us.

In recent years she had health issues, hospitalizations, breast cancer and heart issues, but that did not stop her or slow her down, She would astonish Doctors and staff during her recent hospital stays with her humor, and strength. The day she was transported to surgery from the intensive care cardiac unit in December of 2021, she had the surgical staff and nurses bursting with laughter through the quiet sullen hallway of the ICU. That is who she was, a fighter, a comedian, a story-teller, Our Mother, Fix your crown, you're the daughter of a King. As hard as it was for you to rest, Rest In Paradise.

We live in the peace of knowing she lived her life everyday to the fullest and is

in the arms of Our Savior and Lord Jesus Christ.
