Viola Nold, 98, San Antonio, TX, formerly of Gettysburg, SD, peacefully passed away in her sleep on February 4, 2018 at Regent Care Center Oakwell Farms. Graveside service will be on February 7, 2018, at Mission Park North, San Antonio, TX.
