



## Virginia Louise Bright

Virginia "Ginger" Bright of San Antonio, aged 74, passed away quietly in the company of her loving daughter Donna at Colonial Gardens Assisted Living Center in San Antonio on Monday, 12/7/2020 after a long and difficult battle with Vascular Dementia and Alzheimer's Disease.
