Virginia Alsup Flood was embraced by a tender Lord on January 8th, 2009.

She was born on September 23rd, 1916 in Galveston, Texas, the daughter of Hazel and Gideon Alsup. Virginia married George D. Flood, Jr. on June 10th in 1939.
