August 16, 1931 - January 20, 2019

Virginia Celea Munger Frazelle, aged 87, passed away January 20, 2019 about the time when she was supposed to be getting ready for her Sunday School class, taught by her sweet teacher, Carol Edwards, and worship at Baptist Temple and went straight to Heaven to worship God and Jesus in person.

Virginia was born in Ironton, Missouri to Andrew Munger and Norma Wright Munger. Andrew moved his family to the Rio Grande Valley to work in the agricultural industry and farm. Virginia, her brother, and sister grew up in Santa Rosa, Texas. After graduating from high school, “Ginnie” went to Southwest Texas State Teachers College (now Texas State University) and graduated with a teaching degree. She began her teaching career in Corpus Christi, Texas, took a hiatus to raise her family, and retired from Sam Houston High School where she taught Home Economics and Life Skills.

While in Corpus Christi, she met Travis Weldon Frazelle at Second Baptist Church and married on June 13, 1953. They were married for 60 years before Weldon passed away in 2013. Where they met tells a lot of her and Weldon’s strong faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as their Savior and they passed this love and faith on to their children, Marcia, Andy, and Rhonda. Virginia was a lifelong member of Baptist Temple, San Antonio, where she served alongside Weldon as a deacon’s wife in many capacities – 3rd and 4th grade Sunday

School teacher and director, singing in the choir, going on mission trips with Weldon, and serving on numerous committees. You could always count on her to be behind the scenes in organizing, preparing, and serving meals for various events at the church. She loved serving the Lord with her WMU ladies and being involved with the Young-in-Heart Senior Adult group at Baptist Temple. She enjoyed sewing, counted cross stitch, reading, and traveling. She was a beloved wife, sister, mother, and grandmother and will be greatly missed.

Virginia is survived by her three children, Marcia McDonald (Terry), Andrew Frazelle, (Monika), Rhonda Frazelle; grandchildren – Travis McDonald (Kalee), Emily Frazelle, and Suzannah Frazelle; sister, Jacque Vandiver, brother, Eugene Munger (Karen), brother and sister-in-law, Billy Joe and Suedell Frazelle, and numerous nieces and nephews.
