



Virginia Yanez

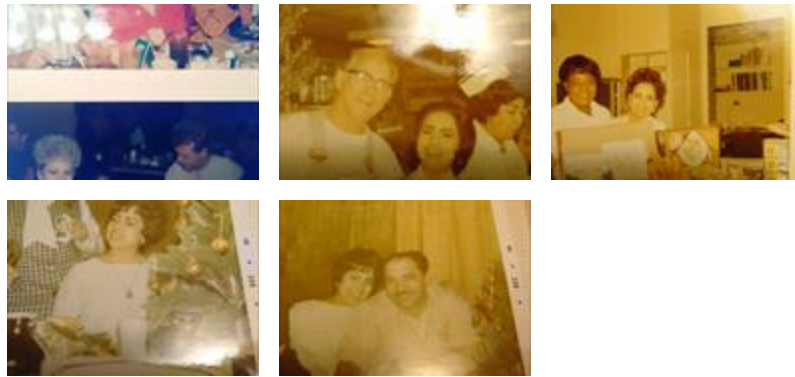
November 2, 1929 - May 14, 2017
