Shortly after Robert joined the Marine Corps to help win the battles of World War II, his young wife enlisted into the WAVES Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service which was the World War II women's branch of the United States Naval Reserve. from 1944 through 1945 and became a very proficient aviation machinist mate at Brooks Army Air Base and was featured on the cover of Collier magazine, as she and other brave women were helping in the War effort. At the conclusion of the War, Vivian and Robert commenced to raise a family; surviving son Robert E Rohmer Jr of Elmendorf, Texas and Granddaughter Judi Alvey and her husband Tim of Newnan, Georgia, great-grandson Tyler Alvey and great-granddaughter Jordan Alvey of Newnan Georgia and surviving son William Joe Rohmer and his wife, Annetta Rohmer including grandsons William J Rohmer Jr and Great-granddaughter Kinslee and Edward Lee Rohmer and his wife Shelley of Elmendorf, Texas.
