November 14, 1931 - May 18, 2017

It is with deep sadness that we mourn the loss of our dad, Wallace E. (Wally) Crow, age 85, who passed away suddenly on Thursday, May 18, 2017. Dad was born on November 14, 1931 to parents George Cecil and Pauline Crow in San Antonio, attended Jefferson High School, and served in the U.S. Navy. He married our beautiful mother, Margery Reinagel in 1954 and they had 3 wonderful children. He is survived by his children Karen Apodaca (Jake), Brenda Lewis (Barry), and Tom Crow (Rose), grandchildren , Brian (Becky), Mark, Jacob (Stephanie-fiancée) Apodaca, Shalmir Petsche, and Jenna (Jason) Carpenter, 6 great grandchildren, sister Betty Icke and his new love/partner Janice Coley.

Dad worked for the Campbell Soup Company for over 20 years. Mom and Dad were married for 60 years and he had become her devoted caregiver before her passing in January 2014.
