Walter Seth Stanley, Jr. passed away on April 2, 2009 in LaVernia, Texas. He was born September 5, 1923 in Harrisburg, Texas to Zana and Walter Stanley. He graduated from Brackenridge High School in 1941 and enrolled in Texas A&M but withdrew and joined the Army Air Force in January 1943. He served in the South Pacific and was discharged as a Corporal on December 23, 1945. Upon his return from military service, he worked for several insurance companies as a claims adjuster. He later joined the Bexar County Sheriff's Office where he reached the rank of Captain. In May 1981, he received a BS in Criminal Justice from the American Technological University. He also worked for the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Officers Standards and Education as a Senior Consultant in the Enforcement Section. Walter was a proud member of Sheriff's Association of Texas and the Guadalupe Valley Peace Officer's Association. Walter was a Past Master of Lonnie Irvin Daylight Lodge No 1309 AF & AM in San Antonio, TX, York Rite Knight Templar, Scottish Rite 32° Mason and Alzafar Shriner. He was very active with his Lodge and the Shrine Provost Guard. He was honored to serve as the District Deputy Grand Master of District 39B.

He was a member of Solid Rock Church of Kerrville and served as the church treasurer. He was preceded in death by his first wife Johnnie Callahan Stanley, his second wife Lurlene Williams Stanley, his mother Zana Stanley, his father
