Wanda Lee Freeman Crane peacefully passed away on April 30, 2011 at the age of 83. She was born on September 13, 1927 in Cache, Oklahoma. Wanda was preceded in death by her husband of 59 years, Russ Crane. She is survived by her son, Don Crane; and daughters Julia Crane McArthur and Cherry Crane Stengel.
