Warren Herrmann, age 82, of San Antonio, Texas passed away December 1, 2018. Warren was born on August 10, 1936 in San Antonio, Texas to Ellen and William Herrmann.

He graduated from Brackenridge High School in 1954 and Texas A&M in 1963 with an Accounting degree. He served in the Marine Corps for 3 years aboard the U.S.S Lexington.

Warren brought such steady levity to all of our lives, and as such, the weight of his absence can be aptly felt. In the same respect however, because of his joyful disposition, it is easy to see him every day. When I trip over my feet I'll know that he is watching over me, laughing. When the Aggies win a game, I know that he is watching over us, cheering and laughing. When his family and loved ones gather to start "Tellin' lies" about him, he will be there with us laughing. Warren has left us with the simplest and happiest way to remember him: laughter. Sometimes, and I think Warren would agree, less is more. Therefore, I think all that there is left to say about Papa, Daddy, Brother, Herm- Warren, is, "What a guy!".
