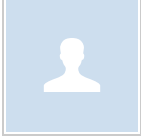

“ Warren Lee Hutchinson was a man of God and God's man. My family and I were blessed by God to come to know Warren, his wife Shirley and their two children, Cherylee and Daryl for over 38 years. Warren was and is, my best friend. I credit Warren as being the key person responsible for me remaining and being a Christian today. He was always there for me and my family. His knowledge of Scripture was exceptional! I was blessed on many occasions to study the Bible with Warren. His insight and wisdom when it came to explaining what a particular passage of scripture meant and how one should apply the Word of God to their lives was phenomenal. No one I have associated with in my 75 years of life believed in; put into practice and lived the Greatest Commandment (Matthew 22:37-40) moreso, than Warren Hutchinson. Even so, he would often say: "I know least in little; but God knows all in all." He and Shirley filled the financial and material needs of countless people in the church and those in society at large, whether they lived in the ghetto or in suburbia when they had a need and could not personally fulfill it themselves. He walked with me often down several roads, day and night for years, to fulfill a need financial, spiritual or otherwise. For example, he and Shirley donated funds to build a church in Russia so the saints there could have a building in which to study, teach and preach the Word of God and worship. Warren and I had a 'Jonathan and David' relationship: spiritually: " I LOVED HIM AS I LOVE MYSELF (1 Samuel 20:17). We served together in ministry and in life! I had the pleasure of participating with him in several Bible Studies over the years to encourage and convert the lost to Jesus Christ. Even with maular degeneration to the point he was legally blind, the eyes of his heart contributed to his compassion to do good for others. Space limitation precludes me from expressing more about this great man of God. Even when he was unable to put words together to speak following a major stroke and surgeries, he sought out family members and others to facilitate his hunger and quest to do all he could for others. Rest Well In The Arms Of Jesus, My Brother! You have fought a good fight and you have completed the race God set before you to run. I cannot imagine life without you; but I look forward to being on the other side of Eternity with you
