Wayne E. Schulz of Floresville passed away at his home on Saturday, September 4, 2004 at the age of 62. Mr. Schulz was born in San Antonio on December 29, 1941. He was a former resident of Alpine and Amarillo and had lived in Floresville since 1977. Mr. Schulz was a math instructor at Sul Ross State University in Alpine and West Texas State University in Canyon. He retired from Civil Service after working for the Department of Defense as a Mathematician/Analyst at Kelly AFB, Randolph AFB, and Peterson AFB in Colorado Springs, CO. He also taught math in the evenings at San Antonio College SAC for 20 years. Survivors include his wife of 35 years, Linda Schulz of Floresville, mother Eleanor Schulz of San Antonio, son Karl Schulz and wife Judy, granddaughter Tori Schulz of Pflugerville, brother John James Schulz, Jr. and wife Marilyn of Fredericksburg, nephew John Schulz, III, and nieces Kira Morales, Kristen Schulz and Lyn Schulz.
