



## William (Bill) C. Goodwyn

February 23, 1940 - May 23, 2022

William (Bill) entered eternal rest on May 23, 2022, in San Antonio, Texas, where he joined his beloved Jesus Christ. He was born and raised in Louisville, Kentucky to Mary White Goodwyn and William Cantrell Goodwyn, Sr. and is preceded in death by them.

He was a long time member of The Louisville Country Club where his grandfather was its first president. As a very young boy he learned to play golf and tennis there, which were life-long interests.

Bill attended The Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He finished his education at the University of South Carolina and in Louisville after having served three years in the Marines, earning sharp shooting medals and awards. He set a range record which stood for many years at the Marine Corps. base at Parris Island, South Carolina. A late onset of chicken pox kept him from shipping out to Vietnam and he remained at Parris Island to be a drill instructor.

For over 27 years until present Bill proudly served as a Trustee of Trinity School for Ministry in Ambridge, Pennsylvania as the seminary grew in reputation and stature. He watched and participated in the formation of the Anglican Communion in North America and greatly enjoyed the many friends around the world who came together over many years in its birthing.

After serving as a Trustee of the American Red Cross, Los Angeles, California, he became its Chairman, then went on to become the Chairman of American Red Cross Blood Services of Southern California, and 1985-1986 Rotary International District Governor of the clubs in the Los Angeles area, his home club being the Westwood Village Rotary Club, after serving as its president.

Bill had senior management positions with several national wealth management firms and consulting firms, and was a frequent guest lecturer at global leadership development conferences, including lecturing at the Haggai Institute Leadership Conferences several times at the behest of Dr. John Edmund Haggai.

His love of sports, especial racquet sports, was well known, and he played into his 80th year at The Santa Monica Beach Club, Santa Monica, California. He was a member since 1972 when he moved to California from the South.

In March of 2019, Bill and his wife Judi moved from Southern California to San Antonio, Texas and became members of Christ Episcopal Church San Antonio. He repeatedly expressed his appreciation for the depth of its leadership and the Christ centered focus and worship.

Bill is survived by his wife of 39 years Judith Able Goodwyn, one stepson and daughter-in-law (Shel and Marisa Huston), one stepdaughter and son-in-law (Jennifer Mondelo), 2 grandsons, one sister in Louisville, and various family members and life-long friends.

The inurnment of his ashes will be at Christ Episcopal Church, 510 Belknap Place, San Antonio, Texas 78209 at 10:00 A.M. on Thursday, September 15, 2022 with a memorial celebration to be held at 11:00 A.M. in the church, and a

reception will follow.
