Retired U.S. Air Force 1st Lt. William R. Bond, 92, was called home by the Lord on Tuesday, May 27, 2008. Isaiah 40:31. "Bill" was born on August 25, 1915 to Paul Claude Bond and Clifford Joyce Bond in Oklahoma City, Okla. He was preceded in death by his beloved wife, Edith Fay Bond; son, Lawrence Bond and grandson, Shawn Dunn. Bill came to San Antonio at a very early age and graduated from Brackenridge High School in 1933. Soon after he joined the Army and then went on to Officers Candidate School where he became an Air Force pilot during WWII. Bill was shot down over France in a B24 and reported missing in action on April 19, 1944. He was a prisoner of war liberated from Stalag Luft 3 in 1945. Bill was a Liberator Pilot and holder of the Air Medal with two oak leaf clusters. Bill was an instructor pilot for the Air Force for many years flying many different aircraft; he just loved flying. He also loved golf, making a hole in one at the old Riverside Golf Course, in Southside San Antonio. He retired from the U.S. Air Force in 1972 after 33 years of service. He is survived by daughter, Jeanette Hough of Florida and son, Doyle Weldon Dunn Glenda of Boerne; 7 grandchildren and 9 great-grandchildren. His family wants to express their deepest appreciation to all of the doctors and nurses at Wilford Hall Medical Center. Bill will be greatly missed and was very much loved.
