



## William Jeppesen Henry

August 30, 1920 - March 2, 2008

William Jeppesen "Bill" Henry passed away March 2, 2008 in San Antonio at the age of 87. He was born August 30, 1920 in Wyoming, but was a Texan since 1925. He was educated in Houston and attended the University of Houston until WWII. He served in U.S. Maritime Service and as Chief Engineer of a U.S. Army Maintenance & Repair Ship in the South Pacific. Bill was, for 50 years, actively engaged in major construction both in the U.S. and the Mid-East. He retired from Fischbach and Moore, Inc. and Arabian American Oil Co. He was a member of Charles W. Anderson Lodge No. 1413 AF&AM, Arabian Lodge No. 882, ACGL, Dhahran, Saudi Arabia, Tranquility Lodge No. 2000, York Rite Chapter, Council and Commandery, York Rite College and numerous Masonic related organizations and Alzafar Shrine.
