



William T. Hensey, Jr.

June 22, 1921 - April 3, 2006

William Theodore Hensey, Jr. was born on June 22, 1921 in Middletown, OH, and died on April 3, 2006 in San Antonio, TX. He graduated from high school in Monroe, MI in June 1939. He enlisted in the Army Air Corps in August 1942. He joined the 448 Bomb Group, 8th Air Force in June 1944 as a B24 Bomber Pilot and was stationed in Seething, England. He completed 35 missions, his last being Christmas Eve 1944. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross on April 26, 1945 and continued service in the active Air Force Reserve reaching the rank of Major until 1962. He attended Purdue University and obtained an MBA from the University of Chicago in 1961. His career included 40 years of service with the Inland/Ryerson Tull Steel Company. He moved to San Antonio in 1988 from Munster, IN. He was very involved in various community activities. While in Indiana, he was on the Munster School Board 1966-1972, President of the Munster Bicentennial Commission 1972-1976, President of the Munster Historical Society 1978-1980. While in San Antonio he was involved with the Optimist Club; American Legion, Alamo Post #2, Board of Trustees; Del Donore Home Owners Association Board of Directors. He delivered Meals on Wheels and was awarded the Platinum Leadership Award by SCORE. He was a Republican Precinct Committeeman for 18 years. Bill was very outgoing and never met a stranger. We will miss his vigor for life. He is survived by his wife of 54 years, Jean Hensey; daughters, Ellen Lewtas and husband Ted, Carol Marquardt and husband Jon; step-grandchildren, Kevin Colleen Marquardt and Jennifer

Robert Smith; step-great grandchildren, Dusty and Corrie Smith and William Marquardt. The family wishes to thank the staff of the Cardiac ICU at Methodist Hospital for their loving care.
