William David (Bill) St. John, born on August 28, 1921 in Mustang, Leon County, Texas, passed away on June 2, 2021 at 99 years of age. He was known to family, relatives and close friends throughout his life, as Sonny. He was preceded in death by his parents, William F. and Lyda B. St. John; his wife, June M. St. John; sisters, Berta Mae Bilhartz, Ella Faye Minica; and brother, Evan Eugene; and grandson David William St. John; He is survived by his sons, William F., David E. and wife Linda, Mark R., and Charles D. St. John; and numerous nieces, nephews, grandchildren, great grandchildren and a great-great grandchild. He attended schools in Melon and Pearsall TX. He and classmate Otis F. Reed, now deceased, entered the US Navy in October of 1940. He was stationed at Naval Air Station Kaneohe Bay, Ohau Hawaii, when Japan attacked. He was a Life Member of the Pearl Harbor Survivors Assoc. He and June were married on May 24, 1945 in Newport News, VA by an Army Chaplain. After WWII, he entered Federal Civil Service in Philadelphia and then transferred to Kelly Air Force Base, San Antonio TX where he remained until his retirement in 1978, in which afterwards he entered the civilian workforce at BB Saxon Co. until fully retiring. He and June were life-long members of St. Johns United Methodist Church. He will be dearly missed by his family, relatives and friends. He was a friend of Bill W. and Dr. Bob for over 50 years.
