He would come to my house every Tuesday and teach me something new, I think for 3 years. I still have all the music he hand wrote out for me. He wrote out the words and the chords for songs like Gordon Lightfoot's "If you could read my mind". Glen Campbell was the rage and I wanted to learn to play guitar. Actually, I was suffering from a traumatic brain injury at the time. I had fallen out of a tree, 40'. I had a brain concussion. The guitar, "music", is what calmed my brain down and Harry Pack was the right man for the job. He was calm, a great teacher, had a great smile and I enjoyed my time with him.*

53 years later, I am still learning guitar. In fact, I have never been more excited about it. I have 6 guitars now and will probably have a few more before it is all said and done. I sold my first guitar and would like to have it back, but probably won't happen. My 2nd guitar was a guitar I bought from Harry, a green Yamaha electric. It was cool, but my dad didn't like what I was doing on it, so I sold it back to Harry. I don't know where it is today, but I would love to at least look at it. If someone has it in a closet and not using it, I would love to put it to use. I hang all my guitars out in the open so that I can always pick one up. That is another thing. I am left handed. Harry insisted that I learn to play right handed so that I can pick up a guitar anywhere and play. He was so right. So, I do think of him every day and credit him with saving my life.

I think of Harry all the time. So sad to learn that he passed 17 years ago at age 64. That is how old I am now. Wow! We never know, do we. I can't imagine Heaven without music. I know Harry is in the band, with his smile and his grove. May you rest in Peace my friend.
